The Africa Scout Foundation (ASF) was set up to raise funds to support the growth and development of Scouting in the Region. Over the years, its performance has not been as expected thus this year witnessed initiatives aimed at revamping the ASF to enable it better perform its core fundraising function.

With the vision of “ensuring a future for Scouting in Africa” the Africa Scout Foundation aims to promote the growth of Scouting and support more young people in Africa to gain knowledge, develop skills and attitudes through quality educational programmes towards creating a better world by continuous accumulation and investment of capital fund. - To win support for the movement in Africa by raising awareness on the role of Scouting in the lives of young people and society as a whole.

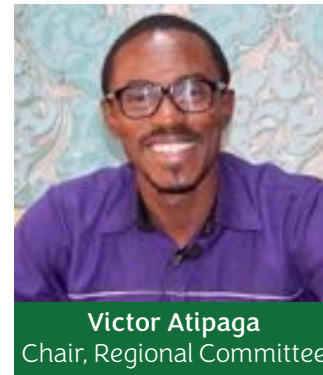
Activities

Scouts Promoting Health Awareness Using Theatre and Football

My Talent My Voice uses an interactive, entertaining approach through participatory community theater performance and football methodology. The theatre team conducts outreaches within schools, markets, local gatherings and chief barazas; while in Football for HIV, the project planners trained football coaches who can then supervise their own teams. The coaches are assessed by the members of the project and the players are given routine questionnaires to assess the level of understanding and HIV knowledge they got from the initiative.

In Kayanza Province alone the project benefited about 500 people.

Scouting Brings Hope, Sense of Belonging and Life-Changing Opportunities to Young People at Dadaab Refugee Camp

Scouting has been providing life-changing opportunities, hope and a sense of belonging to thousands of children and young people at the Dadaab refugee camp in Garissa County, Kenya since 2012. The Scouting for Refugees programme run by the Kenya Scouts Association with the support of AVSI Foundation that is funded by U.S. State Department, has continued to empower young refugees through education, skills development, community service and citizenship activities.

Implemented in all 22 primary and secondary schools across the four camps, about 850 young people are currently benefiting from the programme with hundreds of others having transitioned through. A recent visit to four of these schools; Daidai Primary School, Friends Primary School, Ifo Secondary School in Ifo Camp and Amani primary School in Dagahaley Camp reveals just how transformative this programme continues to be.

Cyclone Idai: When Scouts are Among the 'First Responders'

When Cyclone Idai struck on March 15, 2019, it left parts of Southern Africa to bear catastrophic consequences. Considered one of the worst weather-related catastrophes in the history of Africa, Cyclone Idai affected at least 500,000 people, leaving half of them homeless in mass devastation across Zimbabwe, Mozambique, and Malawi.

As part of Scouting's commitment to serve the community, Scouts of Mozambique were among the first responders alongside humanitarian actors rushing to provide critical aid to the thousands of people affected by the disaster. Over 700 Scouts mobilized across the destroyed cities of Beira, Dondo, Mafambisse, Buzi, Chimanemane Park, Gondola, Mopeia, Nicoadala and Mocuba, demonstrating their readiness of being active and responsible citizens in their communities.


